Ken Catlow came to the Pentagon Renovation Office in July of 1997 as Chief of the Contract Administration Branch. After working in a temporary assignment as Chief of the Construction Integrated Product Team (IPT), he accepted the position of Geographic IPT Leader in September 1999. Following the events of September 11, 2001, Ken was appointed as Operations Group Leader for the Pentagon Renovation Program. In that capacity he is responsible for all on-going construction operations at the Pentagon.

Ken spent a large part of his career in the overseas environment. He served as Resident Engineer at Osan Air Force Base in the Republic of Korea from 1985 to 1996. From 1983 to 1984 he worked as a Contracting Officer's Representative for the Directorate of Engineering and Housing in Hanau, Germany, and from 1980 to 1983, as a Construction Representative in Taif, Saudi Arabia. During these periods of time Ken managed a large variety of military construction projects. Ken started his career with the US Army Corps of Engineers in St. Louis District and moved to Jacksonville District with the Corps in 1979, prior to entering the overseas theater.

Ken holds a Masters Degree in Human Relations from the University of Oklahoma and a Bachelor of Science in Business and Management with the University of Maryland. He is a Licensed Professional Civil Engineer in Guam
